WHAT TO EXPECT

- **Optional** → Thursday, doors will open at 4:00 pm to enable you to be seen by a dentist – before the clinic – to identify your dental treatment plan. (You will then return on either Friday or Saturday for the planned treatment.)
- Friday and Saturday, doors open at 6 am and will remain open until the clinic is full.
- Clinic becomes full early in the day.
- A dentist will help you decide your most important dental needs.
- You will first receive treatment for your primary need.
- If dentists and dental hygienists are available, you may be able to receive treatment for another dental need.
- Dental treatment will be provided on a first-come, first served basis.
- You will be treated when it's your turn, and the **wait may be long**.
- As dentists and dental hygienists become available, you will be taken to clinic area for treatment.
- During the dental clinic, you will be shown how to care for your teeth.
- You will be asked to participate in an exit interview about your experience.

DENTAL TREATMENTS PROVIDED

Fillings	Due to preparation time, a limited number of:
Extractions	Crowns
Root canal treatment (nonmolars)	Flippers
Cleanings	Dentures (Friday only)
Children's dentistry	

DENTAL TREATMENTS **NOT** PROVIDED

Extraction of wisdom teeth	Extractions for patients who are taking:
Root canal treatment of molars	Blood thinner medications
Dental implants	Osteoporosis medications

PATIENTS WITH DIABETES OR HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE

- Blood pressure testing will be performed on all patients, and blood glucose testing will be performed on patients who have a history of diabetes.
- Patients with blood pressure or glucose levels that are too high cannot be treated at COMOM.

CHILDREN AND INFANTS

- Children and infants are welcomed at COMOM to receive dental care.
- If parent/guardian is to receive treatment, an adult must be present to be responsible for the children brought to the clinic.

The Importance of Schedules and Routines

Familiar activities can provide comfort for both adults and children during challenging and uncertain times. Just like adults, children feel more confident and secure when their daily activities are predictable and familiar. A consistent daily schedule and step-by-step routines give children a predictable day. Schedules and routines in the group care setting and at home help children:

- Feel in control of their environment
- Feel safe, secure, and comfortable
- Know what is happening now and what comes next
- Know how to do an activity or task
- Engage in learning

Why are routines and schedules important?

When infants and toddlers are part of familiar activities and routines, they develop relationships with the people they interact with and gain a sense of self-confidence.

As older toddlers and young children grow, they can follow routines, demonstrate emerging independence, and adjust to change more easily.

What is the difference between a schedule and a routine?

A *schedule* represents the big picture and includes main activities that happen across the day.

Routines are the steps needed to complete each part of the schedule.

Reinstating Schedules and Routines

- Re-teach and remind children of the:
- Schedule and routines using visuals
- Steps in common group care routines, such as meal time and washing hands
- Note changes in the schedule that result from being away from the program.
- Review the schedule at the beginning of each day.
- Refer to the schedule before and after activities throughout the day.
- Model the steps and allow children to practice them.
- Provide positive, descriptive feedback when children both attempt to follow or succeed in following the routine.

HOW DO I ENROLL FOR UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL?

UPDATE

Families looking to continue care with a known provider can pre-register during the pre-registration window a child who is currently enrolled, who has a sibling currently enrolled, or who has a parent or guardian currently employed with a Universal Preschool Provider. Families can register at upk.colorado.gov, select their current provider as their first choice, or work with their provider for a direct link. The pre-registration window will match families to their current provider as the **first choice in their application** if they meet the pre-registration eligibility criteria AND they must answer **at least one of the continuity of care questions** in their family application.

Families looking for a new preschool provider can visit upk.colorado.gov to browse high-quality, licensed providers, see if they qualify for additional hours, and register to be matched with one of their top 10 providers of choice during the matching rounds of enrollment.

Families who have yet to register to Colorado Universal Preschool will be able to work directly with a Universal Preschool Provider to enroll during the direct enrollment period, through the end of the school year, as space allows.

Families with a child eligible for special education with an Individualized Education Program (IEP) can register for IEP Direct Placement to align Universal Preschool with their child's IEP through upk.colorado.gov.
